Located in Iqaluit, Nunavut and reporting to the President and CEO, you will ensure the overall direction and deployment of the Arctic Energy Fund (AEF) with a focus on rebuilding community power plants. The position has a significant mandate with a budget of approximately \$230 million, and is accountable for defining, tracking and managing project deliverables while managing and coordinating all related capital projects. As Director of the Arctic Energy Fund, you will call on your proven interpersonal and communication skills, as you coordinate between multiple internal departments, develop collaborative relationships with external stakeholders, and represent corporate interests on all Arctic Energy Fund initiatives, while ensuring compliance with applicable corporate, territorial and federal standards.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

- Overseeing AEF contracts (cost controls, contractors, scope changes, change orders);
- Monitoring and managing AEF turnkey projects;
- Ensuring project planning, budgeting and administration are carried out with due diligence;
- Working closely with other departments to develop short-, medium- and long-term plans and integrate them into departmental goals in support of QEC's business strategy;
- Acting as corporate liaison with public authorities, officials and agencies, and industry representatives;
- Developing and maintaining excellent relationships with community leaders to address their concerns and ensure transparency of departmental business initiatives, programs and projects;
- Acting as a consultant to senior management, the Board of Directors, and Government officials;
- Overseeing tendering and procurement process with Supply Chain Management;
- Leveraging support of Supply Chain Manager and/or Legal Counsel for negotiations with significant financial, regulatory and stakeholder impact;
- Ensuring engineering standards are consistent with evolving utility industry practices, and working closely with Operations and Engineering directors to develop best practices;

- Ability to supervise employees, contractors and consultants; and
- Ability to act as a resource person for other department staff.
